Our Lady of Peace Parish, in collaboration with the Canada Revenue Agency, is pleased to announce that a tax preparation clinic will be provided (**Free of Charge**) to prepare tax returns for individuals who have a modest income and a simple tax situation. Due to **COVID** concerns, all sessions will be performed **non-contact means**.

The tax preparation service will commence March, 2024.

Steve Linton, a parishioner at St. Anthony's Church and volunteer for CVITP, will be available by **appointment** to prepare your income tax and benefit returns.

The service **does not** include tax returns for **complex situations** such as: returns for deceased persons; individuals who file for bankruptcy; self-employed individuals; individuals who report capital gains or losses; or individuals who report employment expenses, or business rental income or expenses.

Our Desert Journey: Lent 2024

When I was young, Lent was about what I was going to give up – candy, movies. Later it took on something like the New Years resolution – what can I do to become better at something. Certainly, that is an improvement. But perhaps there is more. Our observance of Lent has its origins in the early Christian church and is associated with the sacraments of Initiation, Baptism, Confirmation and

Eucharist. These sacraments of welcome generally would take place at Easter. From the earliest of times, Christians developed a process for welcoming new member into the community. When the person was ready to ask for baptism at Easter, there was a final short, more intense period of prayer, fasting and good works. This was Lent – a time of transformation, of conversion.

A scriptural image of this period of intense prayer and fasting and discovery of mission is found in the Gospels. We see it in the desert experience of Jesus. Mark's version of this is brief (1:12-15). After his baptism, Jesus ventured into the desert. There, he searched for where the Spirit was leading him. He struggled with temptations. In that desert, Jesus found his call as well as his mission. Filled with the Spirit, he came out of the desert proclaiming the Good News of the Kingdom.

Lent every year is our desert experience, a time to rediscover our connection with our loving parent God. In the desert of Lent we step back and look at where we are in our journey, our personal Camino. We have been baptized into Christ. What does this really mean for us? How does being members of this community of faith affect us and direct our journey, personally and but also as a community? We do this every year. But this year may be especially significant.

This past October, 2023, our Church embarked on a Synod. Representatives from our global church, lay and clerical, women and men, gathered for three weeks in Rome. They engaged in a process of consultation regarding our faith journey as a global church in the midst our world today. This was the first assembly of the Synod. The second will take place in October of this year, 2024. We are now in the middle of our journey. Local churches, i.e. dioceses and their parishes around the world are asked to spend time in prayer, reflection and open conversation on how we can be a synodal church listening to one another and focused on the mission we have been given as a Christian community.

Perhaps, Lent 2024 is a call to each of us and all of us in our parish communities. We are now being called to enter on a journey that recognizes the many voices, questions, issues and views that our faith must encounter in our time. This is the desert experience we have today. Like Jesus's desert, we are challenged to see where we are called and what our mission is in the 21st century. Like Jesus we are called to take up this mission with prayerful respect, openness and discernment together.

Pope Francis set this course for our Church as he began his journey as bishop of Rome and Pope, in 2013. He issued what is called an Apostolic Exhortation titled: *Evangelii Gaudium* (*The Joy of the Gospel*). In doing so, he expressed the fundamental message of the Good News for all – the message of Jesus the Christ.

The Synod in which we are now involved calls us with his words: "I dream of a 'missionary option', that is, a missionary impulse capable of transforming everything, so that the Church's customs, ways of doing things, times and schedules, language and structures can be suitably channeled for the evangelization of today's world rather than for her self-preservation. The renewal of structures demanded by pastoral conversion can only be understood in this light: as part of an effort to make them more mission-oriented, to make ordinary pastoral activity on every level more inclusive and open, to inspire in pastoral workers a constant desire to go forth and in this way to elicit a positive response from all those whom Jesus summons to friendship with himself. (EG 27) During this Lent, our desert calls us to reflect and discern our ways of becoming true disciples and missionaries of the Good New in 2024.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In 2022, our diocese participated in the local phase of the Synod on Synodality, which culminated in a diocesan report that was sent to the Atlantic Episcopal Assembly in May 2022 for the Atlantic Region Report. During that process, what emerged was the common desire to participate as members of the Church in discerning the will of the Holy Spirit. We committed as a diocese to discerning a path forward that builds on this foundation of Synodality, encouraging and supporting parishes to continue engaging the faithful in ongoing conversations rooted in prayer that will open hearts to the will of God for parishes, the diocese, and the Universal Church.

Since that time, we have worked diligently to share the Gospel of Jesus, paying particular attention to the themes that were identified during that process. We have been building up youth ministry by sending a large group of young people to Steubenville Atlantic last summer, hosting follow-up youth rallies in both Saint John and the Miramichi, and supporting parish youth groups. A diocesan World Youth Day event was held on the Solemnity of Christ the King, and from this, a young adults initiative was born to help form youth leaders in the diocese under the direction of our new Director of Missionary Discipleship Formation, Jim Anderson. Jim will also be working with lay leaders including our Religious Education Coordinators and Catechists at the parish level, forming and equipping them for mission as spirit-filled evangelizers.

We are currently participating in a pilot project of the Catholic Leadership Institute (CLI) which helps to support priests in their role as pastors by offering leadership formation and support. And we continue the important work of casting vision throughout the diocese, drawing people into a deeper encounter with Jesus in the Church by sharing and living out our diocesan mission: Led by the Holy Spirit through the Gospel and the Eucharist, we are called to raise up disciples who are joyfully living out the mission, proclaiming the Good News of Jesus Christ, and making disciples of others.

The work of Synodality continues! In this next phase, dioceses are being invited to reflect on the Synthesis Report published in October 2023 (available on our diocesan website, https://dioceseofsaintjohn.org/synod-2021-2023) and to prepare contributions for the final session of the Synod in October 2024. For the next step in the overall synod process, the Holy See has requested that these reflection sessions involve a more focused number of participants to reflect on specific themes from the Synthesis Report that are of particular relevance to the local church. These more focused discussions build upon the broad consultation of the earlier Synod on Synodality listening events held in 2022.

To that end, each parish will each be inviting 2-3 key leaders to attend two Synod Reflection Sessions to prayerfully engage the following themes in the context of our diocesan mission: *Church is Mission* (theme #8) and *A Synodal Approach to Formation* (theme #14). These sessions will take place during the first two weeks of March. Participants will be people of prayer with a heart for the Church (priests, parish leaders, leaders of synodal teams, and youth in particular) who express a variety of experiences, skills, charisms, ministries within the People of God. This process, which relies on the Conversation in the Spirit method emphasized in theme #2 of the Synthesis Report, will be useful in training parish leaders to listen and discern in their own important decisions at the local level. It will also provide a useful tool for our diocese as we continue the work of listening to the Spirit in the visioning process in the coming year.

As we engage in this next phase it is important to take seriously the words of Pope Francis that "the Synod is about synodality, and not about this or that theme...the important thing is how the reflection is done, that is, in a synodal way." With hearts wide open to the Holy Spirit, we entrust our diocese to Our Lady in the sure hope that through this important work, the Lord will help us truly grow as a listening Church. Please join me in praying for all who will participate.
