#### A Trip to the Mountain

Last week, some terrible, disheartening news broke upon us. The world heard that Jean Vanier who died at the age of 90 last years was investigated by the organization he founded, L'Arche International. The independent investigation released its findings and found that over a period of some 35 years Vanier, the eminent spiritual director, writer, and founder of L'Arche was reported to have sexually and emotionally abused six adult women. The women, without disabilities, testified that the abuse occurred in the context of spiritual accompaniment.

L'Arche is an organization founded by Vanier to offer communities of support and compassionate care for persons with developmental disabilities. It has houses in almost 40 countries around the world and seeks to provide communities for some of the most vulnerable persons in our society.

Michael Higgins, professor of Catholic Thought at Sacred Heart University, Fairfield Conn. and former President of St. Thomas University, Fredericton NB wrote in the Globe and Mail newspaper: "This is devastating news; there is no way that it can be soft-pedalled."

The news is disheartening. It seems so often in our day that our models and mentors, the ones we hold on pedestal as examples for life are precarious. Our trust in them is betrayed by human folly. They disappoint us in their personal lives and behaviour. As Michael Higgins puts it: "None of our spiritual celebrities are bulletproof." They are as weak and vulnerable as all of us are. How do we cope with such loss and disappointment? L'Arche has recognized the courage of these women, thanking them for coming forth. It asks forgiveness and renews its fundamental commitment to the most vulnerable – to serve them with compassion, nurturing their growth in safe and respectful settings.

Life is full of many experiences, many personalities, many challenges and many blessings. Some of these are very attractive, others, we would rather not have. They affect who we are and what we do in life. To have a full life, however, we need them all, for each of us live as both challenges and blessings for others. Such life affecting experiences are what we mean when we speak about *grace*. *Grace* is the free gift of God's spirit and love touching our lives. This gift is with us always, but often unnoticed. From time to time though, we will become especially aware of such *grace*.

On this 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Lent, our Gospel comes from Matthew (Matt.17:1-9). We hear the story of Jesus taking some of his disciples up a high mountain and there they experience the fullness of God in their presence. Jesus is transfigured before them and appears with two of the great Old Testament figures, Moses and Elijah. For that brief moment, the disciples have a glimpse of who Jesus is. It moves and affects them deeply. They wanted to remain there in this time of *grace*.

Remaining on the mountain, in the experience is not possible. The moment passes and they must return down the mountain to continue their journey with all its demands, both negative and positive. But they are affected deeply and the *grace* of the experience, the spirit it offered will change them. From disciples they will become witnesses and will themselves be bearers of the Good News they have encountered in their journey with Jesus. Such moments are life-affecting.

We cannot live always in the light at the top of the mountain. Often, we find ourselves in the darkness of the valleys. In the midst of such darkness, our healing rests in hope, the possibility of light. Matthew describes the transfiguration of Jesus to his disciples as a moment of light. They recalled it when enveloped in the darkness of Jesus's crucifixion. Their light was founded on his resurrection.
