Parish Announcements

COVID Protocol Update

Effective this weekend the Province of New Brunswick is requiring all places of worship in New Brunswick to put the following COVID-19 measures in place. Please note that you will not be asked to show proof of vaccination to attend Mass.

- Masks are required at all times in church buildings.
- Each of our churches will operate at 50% or less capacity.
- Maintain two metres of physical distancing between different households. The only exception to the 2m between households are for those who have arrived together in the same vehicle.
- No congregational singing. A cantor is permitted during Mass.
- No physical sign of peace is to be exchanged during Mass.
- Record names of all attendees and contact information by row or have a consistent assigned seating plan for contact tracing.
- Parishioners will be screened at the door for COVID-19 symptoms and asked if you have been instructed to self-isolate.

Other activities using parish facilities, including Parish Nursing activities, meetings, presentations, workshops and Religious Formation for children, youth and adults will require proof of vaccination or provincially approved proof of exemption to attend for people over 12 years of age.

We encourage parishioners to continue to monitor their health before attending Mass and choose to attend/not attend accordingly. Your cooperation and understanding as we navigate these new restrictions is very much appreciated.

On October 10, 2021, Pope Francis inaugurated "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission", a 2- year-long Synod for the universal Church. The Synod is asking the Church to reflect on how we

journey together as Church, listen and respond to the working of the Holy Spirit in the Church and in the world, and how decisions are reached at all levels: who is involved, who is excluded and how can our processes be improved.

What is a Synod?

A Synod is a formal process, used by the Church, in which a large number of people are consulted on a specific topic for discussion. Though it usually leads to a formal gathering from which a formal document is produced, Synods can involve countless discussion groups that precede the formal gathering, assuring the greatest amount of participation possible.

How Can I Be Involved in the Latest Synod?

Everyone is invited to add their voice. A series of questions have been provided to parishes to gather input. Our Lady of Peace Pastoral Council invites everyone to participate in the discussion, either on their own or as part of a discussion group.

Three Ways to Participate:.

- Join Our Lady of Peace Parish Discussion Groups on Sunday, January 23rd from 1:00 to 3:00 pm at St. Theresa's Church. Registration will be open early January to join a discussion group.
- 2) Fill out the insert in the bulletin, individually or as a group, and submit to the parish office by Friday, January 21st. Please feel free to share to anyone you feel would like to have a voice in this process.
- 3) The Diocese of Saint John has a link to the questions on their website at https://dioceseofsaintjohn.org/synod-2021-2023.
 The last 6 questions will be the focus of our parish discussions.

Christmas Message 2021 "All this took place to fulfill what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet: 'Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel,' which means, 'God is with us.'" (Matthew 1:22-23)

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

We are living in exceptional times. Every day we watch and wait for the latest news, discoveries of new COVID-19 variants, latest case counts, new restrictions, trying to understand how this will affect our daily lives as the pandemic continues to cause many people so much anxiety, fear, and even division. Yet, amid this uncertainty, we are reminded that there is something even greater to wait for – the coming of our Saviour.

In the scriptures Jesus is given the name "Emmanuel", which means "God is with us." In his general audience of April 26, 2017, Pope Francis reminded us that God, "is not an isolated God; he is a 'God-with. In particular, with us, namely, with human beings. Our God is not an absent God, confined to a far-off heaven; he is instead a God "impassioned" with man, so tenderly in love as to be incapable of being separated from him." Jesus was not born into the world to remain on the sidelines. He cares deeply about each one of us. From the time he came into the world, Jesus has remained with us in every circumstance – including our present challenges. This should give us great hope! Because if God is truly with us, then that changes everything.

More than anything else, the world needs Jesus. He is the source of all our hopes and desires. We do not have to live in fear. By drawing near to him and his Church in the Sacraments, especially the Eucharist and Confession, meditating on God's Word in the scriptures, making time for him in personal prayer and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, reaching out to those in need as apostles of mercy, we will experience renewed hope and courage. We will experience Jesus' tender love consoling us, dissolving our fear, and replacing it with his peace. Renewed by God's grace we can face the challenges ahead together, as a Community of Faith.

This Christmas let us turn to Jesus as never before, opening our hearts and surrendering our lives to him. May we echo the words of the Blessed Mother, the first to give God permission by her powerful response – "be it done unto me according to thy word" (Luke 1:38). While we relive the anticipation of those who anxiously awaited Christ's first coming, we look forward to his second coming where his kingdom will be fulfilled. And fully surrendered to Jesus, we wait in joyful hope for his coming into our hearts this Christmas, transforming our lives, our parishes, our diocese, and instilling in us a desire to go forth, strengthened by the Holy Spirit, to make disciples of others.

May the peace of Christ reign in your hearts this Christmas and always!
