Community Volunteer Income Tax Program - CVITP

Do you look forward each year to preparing and filing your annual income tax return? Many Do Not!

Our Lady of Peace Parish, in collaboration with the Canada Revenue Agency, is pleased to announce that a tax preparation clinic will be provided (Free of Charge) at the Parish Pastoral Centre to prepare tax returns for individuals who have a modest income and a simple tax situation. The tax preparation service will commence March 2nd.

Steve Linton, a parishioner at St. Anthony's Church, will be available by **appointment** to prepare your (2019) income tax and benefit returns.

The service **does not** include tax returns for **complex situations** such as: returns for deceased persons; individuals who file for bankruptcy; self-employed individuals; individuals who report capital gains or losses; or individuals who report employment expenses, or business rental income or expenses.

What Face Do We Show?

Our faces are remarkably the same. Every face has eyes, a nose and a mouth. But at the same time they are remarkably different, different shapes, colourings and sizes. Most especially remarkable is that the same face can have many different expressions – joy, sorrow, anger, confusion, shock, indifference, interest and more. What we do not always appreciate is that the face we show can greatly affect others.

What face do we show to our world as a church and as a community? In the Gospel of this Sunday (Matt.5:13-16) we are presented by two very strong images – salt and light. Salt is something that when used will affect taste. When placed in food it spreads throughout the entire item. Light when uncovered will fill a room or a world. It will reach the eyes of all whom it encounters. As it does so, it opens the way to seeing the world clearly in all its wonder. It can even change the way in which we see things.

It is no accident that this passage in Matthew's Gospel is part of what we call the Sermon on the Mount. It follows directly after the opening section of this Sermon, what we call the Beatitudes. These Beatitudes or blessings are descriptive of who we are as disciples of Jesus. They are our identity. In a sense they are our face to the world.

It is one thing to describe what we do as followers of Jesus. We are called to reach out and "do good" in our world. Such an expression of goodness is wonderful but it can be kind of "wooden," it is limited to the moment. Perhaps there is more than that to our call. The "more" is to say – "This is who we are." It is our identity, our face.

The images of salt and light proclaim that we bring who we are, our identity to our world, to all we meet. This is true discipleship. It re-creates the world we encounter into the world of God's plan, God's dream. How can you and I do this? Perhaps it begins with realizing that as disciples we have a face and showing our face as disciples can impact and change our own world. Like salt and light, showing our face places us in solidarity with others, walking with them, experiencing life with them. As disciples we are the face of Jesus, the face of the Beatitudes to our world. We are salt and light.

What face do I show?

A genuine Christian must have the bold, but often hidden, confidence that ordinary daily life is the stuff of authentic life and real Christianity. For this reason, the words 'ordinary', 'banal', 'humdrum', 'routine' and the like, appear frequently in Karl Rahner's writings. For him, 'grace has its history in the person's day-to-day existence with its splendors and failures and is actually experienced there'. The everydayness of Jesus' life grounds Karl Rahner's appreciation of daily life: That which is amazing and even confusing in the life of Jesus is that it remains completely within the framework of everyday living; we could even say that in him concrete human existence is found in its most basic and radical form. The first thing that we should learn from Jesus is to be fully human!
